

Rare 17th-century writing book & instructions, for learning without a master

First edition of a very elaborate basic writing course and copy book, minutely explaining the composition of the various calligraphic hands (françoises, bâtardes, financieres), as well as pen decorations and drawings. The engraved title-page reads, "L'art d'écrire ou Le moyen d'exceler en cet art sans maistre" (suggesting a break with the ancient tradition of learning by apprenticeship or under a school master). The writing examples include numerous exercises of single letters and many alphabets. It also includes illustrations of posture at the writing table, the way to hold the pen and nibs with the angle of cutting




and of the nib to the paper. Instructions are often added as well, engraved in a small neat hand, and attention is given to the lay-out of a manuscript. The course was designed by Jean Baptiste Allais, dit le Beaulieu, and engraved by Louis Senault, who was a leading writing master in his own right and therefore ideally suited to engrave his colleague's writing book. At this date the pointed pen was replacing the broad-nibbed pen, and one of the illustrations present here shows the nib of a pointed pen with the split tip spread open. Some copies were issued with only 4 letterpress leaves (quire A) and many copies are missing letterpress leaves or plates.

With several calligraphic exercises by owners on the endpapers, one with "Fait par moy René Brisson", another "fait par moy Bernard le Brot[?] ... a Paris" and a calligraphic title signed "Guerbois fils".

Lacking the leaf on cutting the pen (which included no writing samples), but otherwise a good copy, with one decorative flourish on the title-page shaved, some spots and stains. The binding is worn, with some cut marks and scrapes, and 3 small parts of the backstrip have been restored with gold-tooling. A rare, attractive and detailed 17th-century French writing book in a contemporary binding.



Rare first and only Portuguese edition of a classic biography of Thomas à Becket (ca. 1118–1170), Archbishop of Canterbury. It is a free translation into Portuguese, probably by Diego Afonso de Miranda, of the Latin "quadrilogus", a conflation of four biographies written by Becket's contemporaries, which was the first biography of Becket to be printed, published in four books in 1495 (that edition added a supplementary fifth book containing documents and letters, not included in the present translation). The quadrilogus brings together information from four of the most important

primary sources, written soon after Becket's death by William of Canterbury (active 1170–1174), John of Salisbury (1120–1180), Herbert of Bosham (Becket's own clerk, active 1162-1189) and Alan of Tewkesbury (d. 1202). There are two versions of the quadrilogus: the earlier one, compiled ca. 1198/99, was not published until 1682, while the present one, compiled ca. 1212/13 was first printed in 1495. The present is therefore confusingly known both as the "second quadrilogus" and as "quadrilogus 1". From the library of the 19th-century Condes de Azevedo e de Samodães, renowned as "one of the best collections of Portuguese books" (Borba de Moraes), auctioned in 1921, with its ink stamp in the margin of A1r and José dos Santos's catalogue description inserted on a slip (formerly tipped onto the front endpaper). With the title-page in facsimile and the preliminaries in a neat manuscript facsimile. Binding slightly worn, head and foot of spine slightly damaged, some browning and water stains, some repaired flaws, tears or wormholes affecting the text.



Much enlarged edition of Steven Blankaart's *Lexicon medicum*, that was first published in 1659. One of the many continually enlarged re-editions was published by the Leiden publishers Boutersteyn and Luchtmans in 1690; our copy is from this edition with a new title-page dated 1701. Some of the re-editions with titles as *Lexicon novum medicum*, or *Lexicon medicum renovate* were published in Germany (Jena, Frankfurt) and England (London), including translations in German and English.

Stephanus Blancardus (Steven Blankaart; 1650–1704) was the son of Nicolaas Blankaart, professor of philosophy in Steinfurt, and of Greek in Franeker. Steven studied medicine in Leiden and became a famous physician in Amsterdam. He published many medical treatises, for example on gout, children's diseases, blood circulation, etc.

First edition, edited by Caussin de Percival, of one of the first complete French-Arabic dictionaries. This dictionary of Egyptian Arabic was compiled by the Coptic Egyptian Ellious Bocthor, a native speaker, and extended with material collected by Caussin de Perceval during the latter's travels in Syria.

Bocthor (1784–1821) travelled to France after serving as an interpreter in the Army of the Orient led by Napoleon Bonaparte. A highly talented linguist, Bocthor became professor of Vulgar Arabic at the École des Langues Orientales in Paris. As a native speaker he attacked the then common practice of teaching Arabic as a "dead language" (Coller). His early death disrupted the publication of the grand dictionary he had been working on for 15 years. Luckily, the manuscript was bought by the marquis of Clermont-Tonnere, who ordered Bocthor's successor at the École, Caussin de Perceval (1795–1871), to complete the dictionary.



Second, expanded edition of an early chronological survey of the editions published by the Aldine Press (1494–1595). It is one of the very few early bibliographies on the output of a publishing house, the more interesting as it regards the famous Aldine Press of Aldus Manutius and his sons at Venice.

Breslauer & Folter mention the present publication in their description of the standard bibliography of the Aldine Press of Renouard: "Although it (Renouard) had eighteenth-century precursors, these were of little value, except perhaps for Antonio Cesare Burgassi's Serie dell'edizioni Aldine (Pisa 1790), especially in its second edition, by Jacopo Morelli (Padua 1790)".

A tiny speck on the title-page and on page 1, otherwise in fine condition and wholly untrimmed, with all deckles intact. Wrappers slightly discoloured and the spine label has a tear, but are otherwise good.

First Dutch translation of this life of Catharine the Great, first published in French in 1797 as *La vie de Cathérine II*. The work includes some remarks on Billings's expedition in the North Pacific, Diderot's stay at the Russian court, Catharine's purchase of the libraries of Voltaire and D'Alembert, etc. The portraits depict Catharine the Great, Peter the Great, Potemkin, Orloff, Poniatowsky (King of Poland) and Petrowitz. Some leaves loosening; without free endpapers. Very good set.


First edition of "the best of the eighteenth-century rare book bibliographies, important for the new classification scheme employed and for the extensive bibliographical data and notes. It is here that the Gutenberg Bible is identified and first described. De Bure was the first in a long tradition of French scholar-booksellers" (Breslauer & Folter). "The long search for a rational order and the demand for a specific professional competence, found expression in the preliminary discourse with which Guillaume-François De Bure (1732–1782) introduced his *Bibliographie*. … Taking note of the different viewpoints of

academics researchers and booksellers, he defined the respective environments and duties of each, comparing the "science des gens des lettres" and the "science d'un libraire", which had as its focus the typographical characteristics of the book and its commercial value, in order to meet the needs of the "amateur" and the "curieux" and to determine the prices of books" (Balsamo).

Volumes 8 and 9 are the sales catalogue of the library of the famed bibliophile and art collector Louis-Jean Gaignat (1697–1768), who had been secretary of the Cabinet du Roi under Louis xv. "This valuable and highly esteemed catalogue", full of "erudite notices" (Horne) was compiled by the De Bure to correct several mistakes in his *Bibliographie*. A 10th volume with tables was published in 1782.

The most important edition of this historical and biographical dictionary on the history of medicine, including many biographies of important physicians, such as Boerhaave and Hippocrates, chemists, pharmacists and surgeons, as well as often extensive and detailed entries on "Anatomie", "Botanique", "Chirurgie", "Chymie" and "Pharmacie". As a result of the publication of his *Dictionnaire*, Eloy is considered one of the most important pioneers of medical biography. After the first edition of his *Dictionnaire* (Liege, Bassompierre, 1755), it took Eloy no less than 22 years to publish this expanded and totally re-written *Dictionnaire* in 1778.

Nicolas François Joseph Eloy (1714–1788) was born in Mons and after his study in Louvain he returned to his native town in 1737 where he stayed till his death in 1788 as a physician. In 1752 he was appointed town physician and in 1754 he became also court physician to princes Anne-Charlotte and prince Charles-Alexandre of Loraine.

First edition of a 2000-page pharmaceutical dictionary compiled by the Dutch physician and poet Kornelis Elzevier (1717-1761). It uses the Latin terms for an enormous number of compounds and substances, with brief remarks in Dutch on their preparation and effectiveness. For various medicaments Elzevier mentions his sources, which include Cordus, Mesue, Mynsicht, Wecker and various other lexicons and pharmacopoeias. The engraved frontispiece shows an apothecary where the personifications of Truth and Experience expell Superstition and Stupidity. On the floor lie several books by popular physicians like Boerhaave, Dodonaeus, Lobel and Lemery, with on the background busts of Hippocrates, Galen and Paracelsus.



Very rare enlarged second edition of a writing master's copybook by the Italian writing master Salvadore Gagliardelli, giving 8 full-page and 269 half-page writing examples: openings of letters to several important political, military, ecclesiastical and legal persons, such as the pope, cardinals, (arch)bishops, emperors, kings, queens and lawyers, but also for example to physicians, painters, sculptors, fathers, mothers, widows and friends. This writing book therefore teaches not only the correct way of addressing the dignitaries of the church and the state, but it also how to address people in a certain profession, friends, family, or just someone in the neighbourhood. All 277 examples are written in a neat chancery cursive: the style introduced by Giovan Francesco Cresci in his 1560 Essemplare di più sorti lettere. The 8 full-page examples include larger interlaced initials and interlaced decorations at the foot, which have no precedent in Cresci's Essemplare. Gagiardelli's present copybook was highly successful because it met a definite need in a status-conscious age. This second edition was augmented in the same year as the first and both are very rare. With the bookplate of the famous book collector Hippolyte Destailleur on the front paste-down and some manuscript writing exercises in the last three woodcut-cartouches after number 269. Binding slightly rubbed, corners a little bit bumped, some spotting, some leaves are repaired, but still in good condition.





First edition of the catalogue of the library of the Dutch Royal zoological society Natura Artis Magistra, best known for its zoo, the oldest in the Netherlands and one of the oldest of mainland Europe. Third edition, revised and enlarged, of a rare practical handbook for practicing notaries, written by Simon van Leeuwen (1626–1682), the most famous Dutch lawyer of the 17th century after Hugo de Groot (Grotius). It incorporates a dictionary of more than 4000 technical terms, many borrowed or adapted from Latin, giving simple definitions in common Dutch. Unlike the second edition, the present third edition explicitly notes that it has been newly revised, improved and expanded. It teaches all theoretical and practical knowledge needed in a notary's office, presented in the form of questions and answers, like a catechism, but sometimes also citing sources. Van Leeuwen's approach is refreshingly anti-bureaucratic.

An extraordinary and nearly complete collection of the earliest alphabets of exotic languages, printed and published by the Sacra Congregatio de Propaganda Fide, sometimes together with one or more short liturgical texts. In many cases the *Alphabetum* is the first publication to use the newly cut type and in some cases the type was the first or virtually the first ever cut for that kind of script. Together they show alphabets printed from types for Greek, Hebrew (meruba & rabbinical), Arabic, Syriac (serto, estrangela and East Syriac), Samaritan, Georgian, Armenian, Ethiopic, Coptic, Devanagari, Burmese and Etruscan. The Vatican established the Propaganda Fide in 1622 to promote Catholic missionary work, especially in the Middle and Near East, and it set up its own printing office in Rome in 1626. The printing office acquired the largest collection of exotic printing types in the world, most of them exclusive to their press. In 1629 they began printing and publishing these small booklets displaying alphabets for exotic languages.

Extremely rare illustrated catalogue of enameled metal signboards, plates and large copper letters intended for signs, name and number plates, a clock fave, etc. The catalogue was issued by the brothers Luigi and Giovanni Ravasi, described on the wrapper-title as the suppliers of the Italian State Railways and the Royal Navy. They offer enameled plates, etc. on iron, zink and copper. No other copies of the present catalogue, nor copies of other catalogues of the firm could be located or found recorded in the literature.

Of special interest is the very large poster showing in full size specimens of the capital E of 5 different styles, each in 6 to 8 sizes (labelled Romano [clarendon], Fantasia [tuscan], Palla [tuscan-like], Bastone [sans-serif, with 3 alternative forms] and Capitale [with roman and clarendon characteristics], 3 to 15 cm), as well as pointing hands, panels and other decorations. 

Beautiful calligraphic manuscript by Claude Remy, writing master and tutor of the children of the Paris *beau monde* for more than a decade before the French Revolution. The author-calligrapher notes in an epilogue that he had executed more than 60 similar instructive manuscripts, not only for his pupils but also for their parents, who greatly valued them, but few have survived. Remy executed it for and presented to Raoul de Choiseul-Gouffier, the young son of Gabriel Auguste, Comte de Choiseul-Gouffier (1752–1817), author of *Voyage pittoresque en Grèce*, who served as French ambassador to the Ottoman Empire from 1784 to the French Revolution, then fled to Russia in 1793 where he served Catharine the Great and her successors as Imperial Librarian and director of the Imperial Academy of Arts at Saint Petersburg. He returned to France in 1802, when the Treaty of Amiens brought temporary peace. Raoul became head of the Russian branch of the Knights of Malta and appears to have succeeded his father as count in 1817.

Remy's "avertissement" notes that he taught not only writing, but also reading, arithmetic, Latin, geography and several other subjects, but that he especially loved to teach the science of the four elements, the principal subject of the present manuscript. It clearly and methodically presents the traditional scientific ideas about air, fire, water and earth, including chapters on the properties of the elements, wind, hurricanes, the moon, the sun, heat, clouds, different climates, the tropics, the continents, the poles, oceans, bays, islands, rivers, floods, eclipses, the products of the earth, bodies, blood, senses, spirit, perspective and geography, even straying to topics such as the church, nobility, government, finances, commerce, artisans, wealth, poverty, education and the existence of God. The 6-page table of contents lists nearly a hundred topics covered. Two earlier Remy manuscripts of his *Traité des quatre elémens* are known, also executed for leading families in Paris.





First edition of grammars and vocabularies for three languages spoken by Australian Aborigines, compiled by William Ridley, professor at Sydney University and Minister of the Presbyterian Church of New South Wales. Ridley (1819–1878), an English missionary, came to Sydney in 1850. He wished to learn these languages in order to teach the Aborigines and carry out missionary work among them. Since the Aborigines had no written language, the present book forms a primary source for the languages as they existed more than 150 years ago, when they had had less contact with the Western world. He

writes that he found these Aboriginal languages to posses a remarkable regularity and exactness, and that they "indicate an accuracy of thought, and a force of expression, surpassing all that is commonly supposed to be attainable by a savage race". In 1866 that was a remarkably progressive notion. He also adds some notes on Aboriginal names and customs. The book is nicely produced, with lovely wood engravings and interesting as an early example of Australian colour printing. The coat of arms is much like the earliest one known, which dates from 1821, but the third quarter shows a barrel and other goods rather than a harpoon and anchor. With library stamps (including a cancellation stamp) on the endpapers and blank parts of the title-page, and a paper label with manuscript shelf-mark on the binding. In very good condition. The spine is somewhat faded and there is minor damage to the board edges, but the binding is also very good.

It comprises practically all major works published in the realm of medicine before 1800, as well as a highly representative selection of literature on the subject. While the famous collection of Sir William Osler and Dr Harvey Cushing each comprise some 8,000 items, Dr. Waller's includes nearly 21,000, and it is also far superior in quality." (T. 
